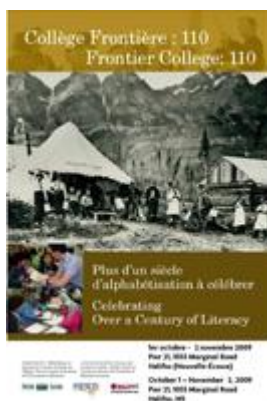


Opening the Doors to Literacy

Frontier College's 110th Anniversary Exhibition at Pier 21 in Halifax



On October 1st Frontier College opened its Exhibition ***Frontier College: 110 Years*** at Pier 21, Canada's Immigration Museum in Halifax. The travelling exhibition, on display at Pier 21 from October 1st to November 2nd, celebrated over a century of literacy for all Canadians.

Frontier College has been recruiting dedicated volunteers to work with Canadian children, youth and adults from all over Canada since 1899. Visitors will discover its rich history filled with stories of Labourer-Teachers working alongside their fellow labourers in mines, lumber camps, railway camps and other remote locations, including stories of how they helped Canada's first newcomers adjust to this wonderful country. Today, Frontier College delivers a wide variety of innovative programs for Canadians who want to learn and enjoy reading.

"Frontier College is proud to partner with Pier 21 to celebrate our 110th anniversary of providing literacy programs to newcomers and Canadians from coast to coast," says Sherry Campbell, President of Frontier College. The exhibit was curated by Dr. James H. Morrison, professor at St. Mary's University in Halifax and official historian of Frontier College. Dr. Morrison was appointed a Member of the Order of Canada on November 5th 2009 for his work in historical research.
