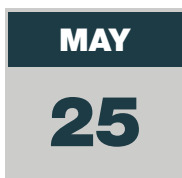

Canadians with higher levels of literacy, numeracy and problem solving skills generally report better health, and stronger connections with their communities and society. This is a key finding from the PIAAC thematic report *The Health and Social Dimensions of Adult Skills in Canada*, a new report released in February 2018 by Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC) and the Council of Ministers of Education, Canada (CMEC).

On **May 25, 2018, from 1:00 to 2:30 PM EDT**, CMEC will be co-hosting a webinar with PHAC on findings from *The Health and Social Dimensions of Adult Skills in Canada*. The webinar will outline key findings and implications from the report on relationships among adult skills, health and social well-being. The evidence from the PIAAC data can inform research, policy and interventions across sectors to improve adult literacy and learning as well as health and well-being through action on social determinants of health.
